Startup Works to Humanize Dog Cancer Drug | One VC Fund's

BIOTECH: Reseda doctor aims to change pharma research.

Dr. **Ilya Rachman** believes drug companies treat cancer as a static problem, but unfortunately cancer evolves to avoid treatments. In response, the Reseda primary care physician started Immix Biopharma Inc. to take a fresh

approach to drug development by using "components" that already exist.

The strategy has yielded Imx-110, an experimental medicine that has brought remission to a dog with late-stage lymphoma.

"I decided to take what science already had, the technologies already available, and mold them into clinical products," Rachman said. "I thought this was common sense, but not in

Antelope Valley plane maker pushes the envelope for fast assembly

t Northrop Grumman Corp.'s aerospace facility in Palmdale, a center fuselage for the Air Forces' F-35 Lightning II fighter jet rolls off the assembly line every 36 hours.

That's a fast pace for aviation work, but

the defense contractor's plant is designed for speed.

"The F-35 (assembly line) facility itself was designed with lean manufacturing principles meant to keep costs down, keep us on schedule and maintain top quality," Andrew Reynolds, vice president in charge of F-35 production, told the

Business Journal.

Northrop Grumman employs 4,100 people in Palmdale, making it the No. 1 company on the Business Journal's annual list of Manufacturers.
